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- 1) **OPTIONS.** Option to renew only for an additional term.
- 2) **REQUIRED PROVISIONS.**
- a. In accordance with **Exhibit A, Section 3.A., Term and Orders of the Participating Addendum ("Contract")** between the **State of Colorado, Department of Personnel and Administration, State Purchasing Office ("State")** and **Conserve-A-Watt Lighting, Inc. ("Contractor")**, the State hereby exercises its option for an additional term beginning **October 1, 2014** and ending on **February 28, 2016** at the pricing specified in the **Original Participating Addendum** as amended.
- b. **Multiple Amendments/Options Exercised:** As the **Participating Addendum** represents a **State Price Agreement (#45000YYY14M/WSCA), Industrial Supplies and Equipment – Lamps, Ballasts and Fixtures** where unit pricing is established, the amount of the current fiscal year value has not changed as consideration for goods/services ordered under the **Original Participating Addendum** effective **06/30/2011**, as amended for the current fiscal year **2015**. The **Participating Addendum** shall have been amended as follows: **Amendment #1 (CMS #41346)** effective 02/28/2012; **Amendment #2 (CMS #44519)** effective 05/24/2012; **Option Letter #1 (CMS #53463)** effective 02/21/2013; and **Option Letter #2 (CMS #64268)** effective 01/21/2014.
- 3) **Effective Date.** The effective date of this **Option Letter** is upon approval of the State Controller or others delegated; whichever is later.
